In order to gain access to the building, you will need your **King's ID card**.

You will then find the **Library Information Point** straight ahead.

Spread across **two floors**, the library hosts a variety of study spaces, such as:

- Computer Rooms
- Group Study Rooms
- Study Pods
- Video Call Pods
- Postgraduate Zone
- Wellbeing Area



If you want to find a book, use the **Library Search PCs**. Note the collection, classmark, and location of it.

Then use the directions on the <u>floor plans</u> (pinned to the walls throughout the library and available on locations pages) to get to the book. All the standard one-week loan books are on the second floor.

Once you have found the book, use the **self-service kiosk** in front of the Library Information Point to borrow it (you will also use it when returning the book).

There are multiple **Computer Rooms** equipped with **PCs**. To access one, you just need your King's login details.

You can find an available PC using the **PC-free** system. Moreover, you can borrow a **laptop loan** from the laptop cabinets behind the Library Information Point.





Most computers situated outside a computer room will be operating as a **Plug and Play Screen**, allowing you to connect your own devices for a flexible and personalised experience.

Plug the USB-C cable into your device as shown below to use the desk's monitor, keyboard, and mouse.

Make sure you book them online using our LibCal system.



Additionally, there are many other reading spots and study spaces throughout the library. Including **Study Pods (SP)** and **Video Call Pods (VP).**

## Find your Zone



- Please keep any conversations brief and lowvolume (whispering level), including no talking on your phone.
- You can consume lidded drinks and cold food.



- No talking in silent areas (including on your phone) and you should keep other noise to a minimum
- Please move to another zone if you need to talk, eat or undertake other tasks that may impact others' opportunity to study in silence.
- You can consume lidded drinks only, no food permitted.



- You can work together and use your phone.
- You can consume lidded drinks and cold food.

There are three different Zones in the library which are colour-coded on the <u>Floor Plans</u>. Choose a zone that suits your study needs and be mindful of others studying around you.
