Project Description:

Survival in a competitive and dynamic market is a challenge to any size organization. The world economy along the years has been going through a deep transformation. Going abroad represents an opportunity for companies to reach new customers, but they also must face challenges like different political and economic scenarios, new players, laws and regulations. The internationalization process of companies was originated in developed countries, however a significant change has observed in the past three decades when emerging economies have become progressively attractive to business and there has been a significant increase in the number of small companies, including Brazil which started to go abroad. The small business tends to be engines of job creation, since they represent the core of innovation and entrepreneurship. On the other hand, small business suffers constantly with changes occurring in the international and internal market, influencing directly their competitiveness and survival.
