MISCONDUCT GUIDANCE

As members of the King's community, students are expected to adhere to the regulations, procedures and policies of the College, to show respect for the persons within and for the property of the King's community, and to behave in a way that does not interfere with the proper functioning or activities of the College. Where there is reason to believe that the behaviour of a student falls below the expected standards, as set out below, and/or where regulations, procedures, and/or policies have been broken, as outlined below, the Misconduct Procedure will be instigated. The Procedure extends to alleged misconduct by a student occurring on or off College premises (including via electronic means, such as email and social media) where the alleged victim is the College itself, a member of the King's community, or a visitor to King's.

Please note that the examples of unacceptable behaviour listed below are not exhaustive. The university can bring action in relation to other unacceptable behaviour. Additionally, the indication of the sanctions which may be applied if certain behaviour is found to have taken place is illustrative only. King's will consider any mitigating and aggravating factors when determining a penalty. Such factors include, but are not limited to, elements of discrimination, instances of previous misconduct, and mitigating circumstances occurring at the time of the alleged incident. A full list of the sanctions which may be imposed is set out in the Misconduct Regulations.
