'Mistaken Identities: Roman Emperors in Modern Art'

Renowned British classicist, TV celebrity and King's alumna, Mary Beard, talks about ancient Rome in the modern artistic imagination. The lecture celebrates the fifth anniversary of the Rumble Fund in the Department of Classics, and is co-hosted with the Centre for Hellenic Studies. Places are limited to 400 people.
