British Academy Postdoctoral Fellowships 2025 Internal selection process: guidance for applicants & Faculties

Research Strategy & Development May 2024

King's College London would like to invite outstanding applications to BA Postdoctoral Fellowship scheme. The scheme provides three-year fellowships for early career researchers within three years of submission of PhD (who have completed their viva voce between April 2022 and April 2025). Fellowships are tenable in all fields within the humanities and social sciences. This is a highly competitive scheme: the success rate is typically no more than 10%.

Each year the Arts & Sciences Faculties support a limited number of applications, in response to the BA's demand management recommendations and to ensure the high quality of the applications put forward to the BA.

Those who are successful will join a vibrant community of postdoctoral research fellows at King's who have been supported through this and other external and internal competitions in recent years. King's is committed to supporting the scholarship and career development of these fellows, and each will be fully integrated into the life of their host Department/School.

Overview

King's invites prospective candidates to contact a mentor in their proposed Department/School, who will consider the subject area and applicant CV and confirm their support and its fit with the research profile or priorities of the department. If candidates do not have in-principle support from a mentor they will not be considered at the next stage.

King's will then consider and select candidates through Faculty-level assessment. Successful candidates will be invited to develop their proposals for submission to the British Academy with King's as their host institution. We anticipate submitting around 25 applications across the Arts & Sciences Faculties. **Please note that we will not accept or support applications that do not adhere to the internal selection and application process.**
