*Outcome Measures in Palliative Care: Using the POS Family of Measures*

## Where? What?

The two day 'Outcome Measures in Palliative Care: Using the POS Family of Measures' workshops will be held on 7th and 8th of February 2019 at King's College London, Cicely Saunders Institute (London, UK).

During the event, there will be workshops and interactive sessions on implementation of the POS family of measures. This is an exciting opportunity to practice administration, scoring and data capture using measures. For the first time we are offering *POS Clinics* where you will have the opportunity to share your experiences with an expert panel.

**Day 1 - Clinical Day (7<sup>th</sup> of February)** is designed to address outcome measurement in clinical settings and scenarios where you will be introduced to the concept of outcome measurement, the POS family of measures, their integration, administration, scoring and interpretation of outcome measurement into routine practice as well as in demonstrating the effects of your service and the integrated reporting of data.

**Day 2 - Research Day (8<sup>th</sup> of February)** is designed to address use of the POS family of measures in research and bring you up-to-date with latest methods relating to research with the POS family of measures. You will be informed about the latest research with generic as well as condition specific measures and their global use in different research settings. You will also explore current approaches to analysis and interpretation of routinely collected data.

This year's event includes a number of presentation sessions, where you and your team will have the opportunity to present your work. We welcome abstract submissions on your work related to the application and validation of POS family of measures in clinical or research settings.

## Who is this event for?

The event is for all professionals from all around the world (nurses, doctors, physiotherapists, psychologists, occupational therapists, social workers, managers, allied professionals, commissioners and researchers) with an interest in palliative and end-of-life care.
