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Introduction

What is the MHPSS Directory?

The MHPSS Directory is a broad and detailed list of organisations providing mental health and social support services to migrants, refugees and asylum seekers in London and Greater London.

Who is the MHPSS Directory for?

This Directory is designed for refugees and migrants looking for mental health and psychosocial support for themselves or others. This resource can also support professionals, such as medical practitioners, social workers and legal advisers who need to refer refugees and migrants to relevant mental health and psychosocial support services in and around London.

About Us

We are a team of researchers based at the ESRC Centre for Society and Mental Health at King's College London. Our work seeks to better understand the social consequences of mental illness among migrant and refugee communities. As part of this, we mapped mental health and psychosocial support services available to refugees and migrants in London to make them more accessible.

The Directory lists 120 organisations offering services that include:

- Social support (e.g., social activities, training courses, career guidance, mentoring for children and adolescents, language training, housing)
- Legal advice (e.g., immigration, help with settlement or citizenship applications)
- Family support (e.g., activities for parents and children, after-school activities, counselling on marriage, family dispute and domestic violence)
- Wellbeing-focused services (e.g., community support groups, emotional support, mental and physical health support, help accessing healthcare services)

Some services are provided to all groups, others support people from a particular nationality or ethnic group, or are specifically designed for women, children, adolescents or older people.
