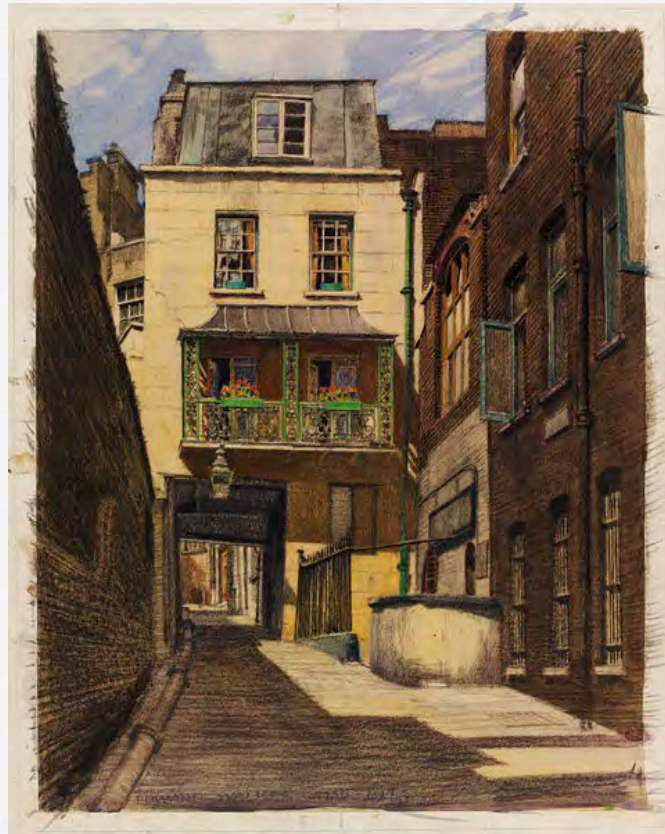

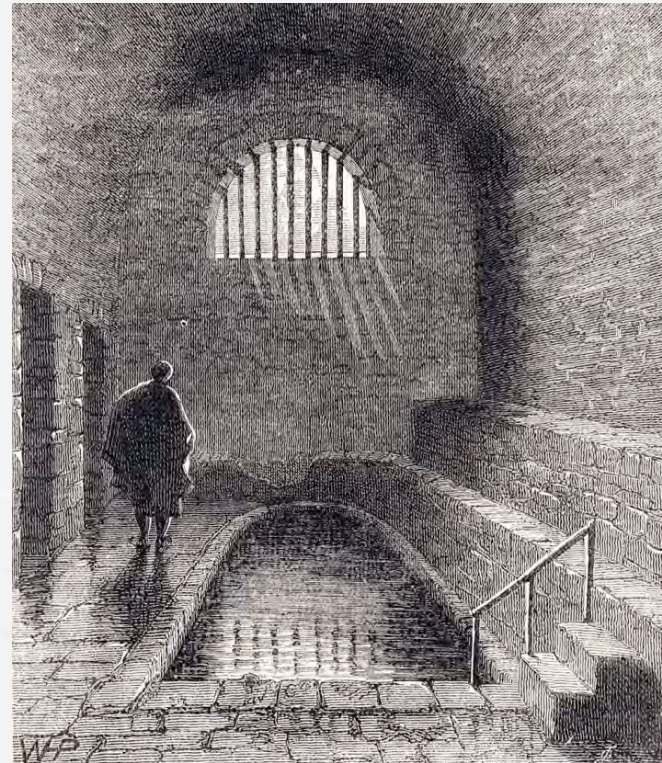

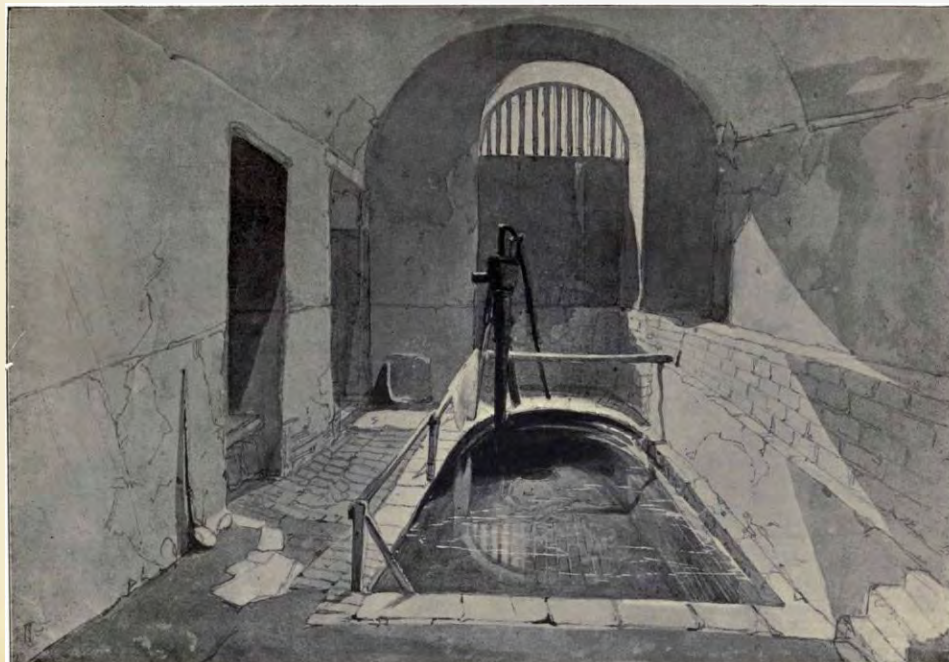

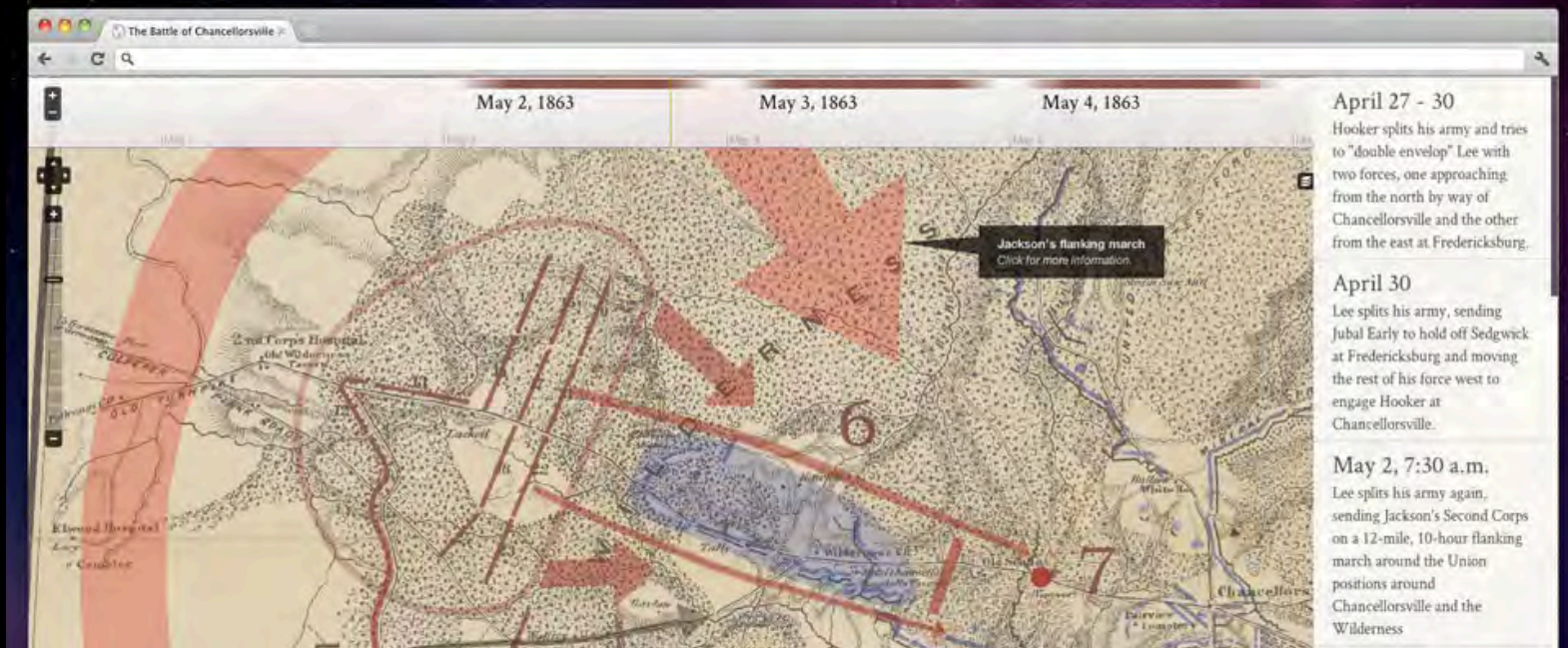

1939 1940 1941 1942 1943 1944

Oct 20 1944
forces land in the Philippines; General MacArthur keeps his famous promise: "I shall return."

Oct 22 1944
The whole Japanese Combined Fleet sets sail, intent on stopping the allied landings on the Philippines.

Oct 24 1944
The Battle of Leyte Gulf begins in earnest. It will be the largest naval battle of World War Two.

Oct 26 1944
The Battle of Leyte Gulf ends in a massive US victory. The Imperial Japanese navy is destroyed.

Oct 29 1944
Anne Frank is deported from Auschwitz concentration camp to Bergen-Belsen.

Nov 1 1944
Kamikaze attacks intensify around Leyte Gulf off the Philippines.

Nov 7 1944
The Japanese hang the spy Richard Sorge at Sugamo Prison, Tokyo.

Nov 9 1944
US General George Patton's army crosses the Moselle River, heading for the heart of the German Reich.

Nov 14 1944
The Chinese cross the Irrawaddy River near Shwagui, Burma.

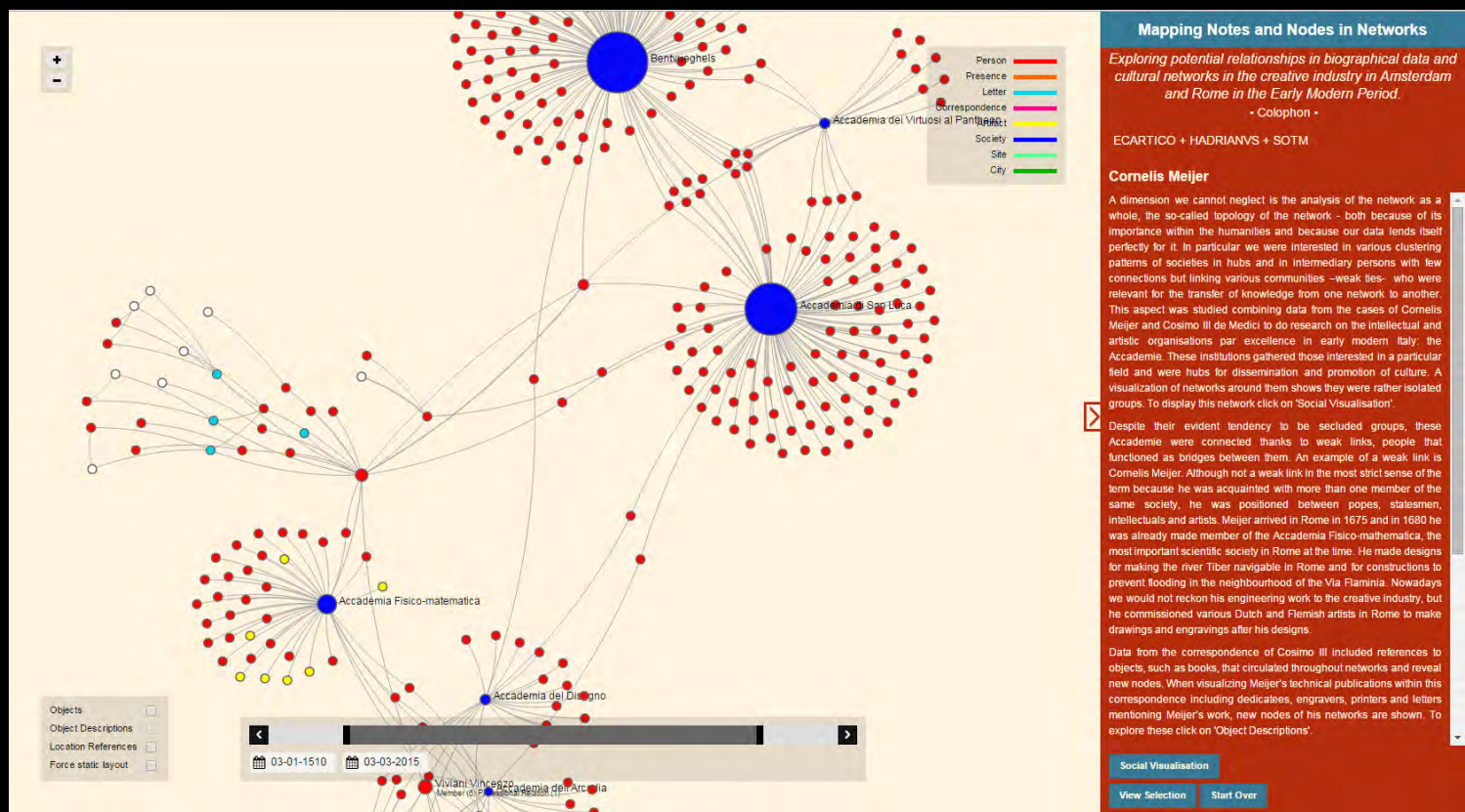
