

6. Executive Dean's report-Professor Michael Escudier

The past year has seen many achievements, opportunities and successes at the Faculty.

Last year we launched our ROAR project, where students and staff used the investigation of dinosaur teeth and evolution to inform and inspire awareness of study at university, STEM and healthcare subjects. The project has visited schools in the Medway region in South East England and continues to inspire young people into study with more visits planned.

Our international reach continues to expand with a new Memorandum of Understandings signed with the British University in Egypt last year.

Our staff continue to impress and have received many accolades and awards, including the Lister Prize, the Cozzarelli Prize, and prizes at the British Society of Oral and Dental Research to name just a few.

Professor Jenny Gallagher, was elected as the International Association for Dental, Oral & Craniofacial Research (IADR) Vice-President. Professor Gallagher has recently concluded a successful term as the Dean for International Affairs at the Faculty of Dentistry, Oral & Craniofacial Sciences at King's, and will continue to act as an Ambassador for International, Engagement & Service for the University.

In December, Awais Malik, a current student at the faculty was invited to speak at the first Inter-University Conference on Youth, Education and Research at the United Nations in New York. During his visit, Awais shared his expertise and insights and contributed to the development of strategic policies to help support the mission of improved youth education worldwide. We are incredibly proud to have Awais representing King's on this global stage. Our newly established Dental Therapy and Hygiene degree saw it's first cohort of students graduate in recent months. This programme combines the latest thinking in dental education with the clinical experience required for the future dental therapist and it was wonderful to see the new graduates embark on their careers outside the university. This year we also launched our very first FoDOCS Staff Awards. We've had over 175 nominations and it's been so heartwarming to hear about the wonderful activities our staff are involved in. I am incredibly privileged to lead such a vibrant Faculty. We will be holding an Awards Ceremony in April and will share with our alumni community the details of the winners in due course.

As you may be aware Professor Kim Piper, Dean for Education at the Faculty, has recently taken up the position of Academic Director for Student Success reporting to the Vice President (Education and Student Success) to drive forward institutional priorities around Widening Participation and Student Success.

Kim achieved much in her time as Dean for Education. She launched the new BDS curriculum, oversaw the introduction and accreditation of our new Dental Therapy and Hygiene (DTH) degree and expanded our widening participation and outreach activities. Her passion for education is only surpassed by her cake baking skills!

Her leadership, during the pandemic ensured our students could continue their education and graduate on time. This included the establishment of the high-fidelity haptic suite which won "Technological or Digital Innovation of the Year" at the Times Higher Education Awards 2021. There are many more achievements we could list, but Kim's ideology of kindness to all is one I hope will stay with the faculty.

On a different note, The Faculty and its alumni have a long tradition of philanthropy and donations have directly supported our students and our research, and it makes a tremendous difference. Whether that is mentoring a student, helping with a grant for someone struggling with the increased cost of living, or helping to purchase some new equipment which can be used day in day out, it is very much appreciated.
