rosthodontics at King's College London has an outstanding reputation in the UK and Europe and rivals the best in the USA. Trainees either spend three years full time (overseas), or complete part time over four years (UK/EU). The programme delivers clinical training from some of the most internationally respected teachers of prosthodontics. The feedback from trainees has been overwhelmingly positive and they regard the course as the best.

Our trainees produce a large number of crowns, implants and dentures. The total output from the laboratory is 4,500 crowns per year and around 550 fixtures are placed each year. Based in new, state-of-the-art facilities on floor 22 at Guy's Hospital, the opportunities in the faculty are unrivalled.

This MClinDent programme has 60 per cent of the time dedicated to clinical experience in fixed, removable and implant prosthodontics. The training includes personal and close mentoring, chairside guidance, small group tutorials emphasising the importance of the evidence base for prosthodontics in the literature, and creates new research opportunities. A research project is also undertaken.

Our aim is to produce highly knowledgeable professional in prosthodontics at the specialist level. The programme has formal recognition as part of UK specialist training.



Professor David Bartlett

Professor David Bartlett is head of Prosthodontics and the MClinDent course at King's College London Dental Institute. David has published over 100 research publications, written three books, numerous chapters and is internationally known for his research on tooth wear and, in particular, acid erosion. David is an internationally respected specialist in prosthodontics and runs the largest specialty training programme in prosthodontics in Europe.



Dr Kalpesh Bavisha

Kalpesh Bavisha obtained his BDS from University College London in 1991. He continued training to receive a Master of Science and a Fellowship in Dental Surgery. He is on the following specialist lists: prosthodontics, restorative dentistry, periodontics and endodontics. He is a part-time consultant in restorative dentistry and clinical lead of dental implants.

He teaches on the MClinDent programme and has lectured nationally and internationally. He also works part-time in private practice.

Satinder Chander is a consultant in restorative dentistry and has a special interest in oral rehabilitation of adult cleft lip and palate patients.
