Request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (“the Act”)

Further to your recent request for information held by King’s College London, I am writing to confirm that the requested information is held by the university.

Your request

We received your information request on 29 October 2022 and have treated it as a request for information made under section 1(1) of the Act.

You requested the following information:

I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request some information.

I request the following information about all instances of sexual misconduct reported by students at King's College London, from 2019/20 until the end of the 2021/22 academic year inclusive.

I request information on the following:

- The number of reported instances of sexual assault*
- The number of reported instances of rape (Including but not limited to those that took place within university operated premises, such as the students union, venues and halls of residence)*
- Statistics of whether the perpetrator was a student or member of staff*
- How many of these resulted in expulsion for the perpetrator*
