Further to your recent request for information held by King's College London, I am writing to confirm that the requested information is held in part by the university.

Your request

We received your information request on 6 June 2022 and have treated it as a request for information made under section 1(1) of the Act.

You requested the following information:

I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request some information.

Please may I request the following information for the A100 (Medicine), A102 (Graduate Entry Medicine) and A101 (Extended Medical Degree) courses, for admissions cycles 2021 and 2022 entry:

- 1) Number of applications
- 2) Number of interviews
- 3) Number of offers sent
- 4) Average UCAT score of applicants invited to interview (or points if exact scores are not held)
- 5) Lowest UCAT score of applicants invited to interview (or points if exact scores are not held)

Our response

With regards to 2022 admission data; the requested data is not yet available as the UCAS cycle has not been completed.

With regards to 2021 admission data;

The information you have requested is already reasonably accessible via the King's College Admission's page on the KCL website. The information has therefore been withheld under Section 21 of the FOIA ('information reasonably accessible to the applicant by other means').
