The County Hall: the building we are in

When excavating the 6.5-acre site discovered the remains of large Roman Boat (38' long, 18' wide).
Bronze coins from A.D. 268 to 296

Foundation stone laid in north-east lobby
Saturday the 9th of March 1912 by King George V.
Underneath the foundation stone King laid
bronze box, coins of the time and the building
plans. adjacent to the old Council Chamber.

Housed the London County Council until 1965
responsible for governing London. Then Greater
London Council (GLC) until 1986.

The original Council Chamber of the LCC has
been preserved.



King George Room

- King George V and Queen Mary were Elizabeth II's grandparents.
- They encouraged the development of playing fields to provide children and young people with areas protected for playing games.
- Keen sportsman liked shooting and golf, often attended Wimbledon
- Worryingly George V died in 1936 after being injected with a mixture of cocaine and morphine by the royal physician while gravely sick!
- Survived by his wife who lived until two months short of her 86th birthday and 10 weeks before the coronation of her granddaughter, Queen Elizabeth II.



Queen Mary Room

Both King and Queen had to contend with the First World War in 1914 -1918, with the difficulties of the 1920s: General Strike 1926, Wall Street Crash and depression, which hit hard

BUT King and Queen were well respected, and his Silver Jubilee celebrations reflected their popularity. As Queen mother following the death of George V, Mary spent much time with Princess Margaret and Elizabeth being responsible for their more general education.

Many places and buildings have been named in Mary's honour, including Queen Mary University London (QMUL)
