Expert practice and research suggests why.

- 85 % of the people sleeping rough in the UK have experience of BIG traumas.
- 95% of the people on the streets sleeping rough experience more BIG traumas.

## The Capacity to Act?...

5 Principles of the Mental Capacity Act (MCA) 2005

- Assume Capacity
- Help people have capacity in all practical ways before deciding they don't have capacity
- People are entitled to make unwise decisions
- Decisions for people without capacity should be in their Best Interests
- Decisions for people without capacity should be the least restrictive possible
