# **Course details**

Our Clinical Neurodevelopmental Sciences course includes a clinical observation placement so that you can gain understanding in a clinical environment as well as via teaching and research. Upon completion of the course, you will acquire a systematic understanding of theory, research and practice in neurodevelopmental disorders, develop a critical awareness of contemporary debates and current problems in the field, develop skills of independent learning, critical appraisal and research, apply these systematically in evaluating different forms of evidence and apply the knowledge, understanding and skills gained to current and/or future specialist areas.

#### Course structure

Courses are divided into modules. Over the course of your study you will take modules totalling 180 credits.

#### Required modules

You are required to take the following modules:

- Typical Brain Development & Neurodevelopmental Disorders (30 credits)
- Dissertation (60 credits)
- Intellectual Disability & Forensic Aspects of Neurodevelopmental Disorders (30 credits)
- Clinical Observation Placement (30 credits)
- Research Methods & Statistics (30 credits)

#### **Optional modules**

There are no optional modules for this course.

Part time students will take 90 credits of the required taught modules in their first year. These include Typical Brain Development and Neurodevelopmental Disorders, Intellectual Disabilities & Forensic Aspects of Neurodevelopmental Disorders, the Clinical Observational Placement. In the second year, they will take 60 credits of the dissertation module and 30 credits from the required taught Research Methods and Statistics Module.

King's College London reviews the modules offered on a regular basis to provide up-to-date. innovative and relevant programmes of study. Therefore, modules offered may change. We suggest you keep an eve on the course finder on our website for updates.

#### Location

Our course is primarily taught at the King's College London Denmark Hill Campus.

### **Career prospects**

Our graduates are expected to further their academic career (e.g. apply for a PhD) or enter a career in areas such as clinical psychology, social work, occupational therapy or nursing with expertise in neurodevelopmental disorders.
