


This year, 75 successful applicants received an award in one of the following departments:


- Biostatistics and Health Informatics

- Mental Health Policy


Successful applicants participated in work experience in one of departments outlined above between July-September 2023. In addition to covering materials relevant to the department, workshops covered topics such as introduction to university, academia and research, as well as science communication, Q&A with academics and health professionals. Successful applicants were awarded with £50 book youchers.





















## Feedback on this year's Youth Awards: Satisfaction with...

Learning how to code information in qualitative data

Feedback on this year's Youth Awards: How to improve

Have an online form to ask questions given out every day to ask any questions, and having an answer session of 20/30mins the next morning to answer those form questions

Please could you provide seats for some of the sessions e.g. when we were visiting the animal testing facility, there weren't that many seats. It got tiring standing for long, especially before lunch.

More activities and interactional activities rather than just talking.

- give rough outline
what students do

A small insight into the building would of been very useful too. Like a tour.

The sessions could have a mix of more group/interactive tasks as well as the lecture style.

I wish it was a bit longer as although it was good that it took multiple days, 3 days feels a bit too short to get to know the people you are with.

More career paths information.

Provide a timetable or schedule in advance so we know what we are going to cover, so we could better prepare or research beforehand incase we had any questions on topics of interest.

Maybe make the day a bit shorter

Potentially holding the awards over a week instead of two days as the content felt quite condensed in order to fit the time schedule.

I would also find it helpful to have sent the presentations by email, so I could refer back to them.

More in depth discussion of people's current research. I also felt that the range of ages made it harder for speakers to address the differing knowledge ranges within the group.

Some of the sessions could've been a little bit more interactive and shorter in length.

Make some of the content more in depth about certain areas or provide a handout that go more in detail.
