WORKING ACROSS LONDON

Each of King's nine faculties brings our Vision to life through a range of partnerships across the capital. These collaborations draw on London as both a living classroom and an active laboratory, creating distinctive learning and research opportunities while serving London and helping to ensure the success and wellbeing of the city and its communities.

On these pages you'll find examples of the imaginative ways in which King's faculties are translating these ambitions into action.

Faculty of Arts & Humanities

Liberal Arts module, Lives of London, takes students on an interdisciplinary journey through London's past and present as they explore its vibrant history and culture, as well as the famous streets and spaces of the city itself.

King's Business School

King's Business School works with Westminster City Council to connect local small and mediumsized enterprises with final-year undergraduate students to help to address the strategic challenges that each business is facing.

Faculty of Dentistry, Oral & Craniofacial Sciences

King's dental students' Smile Society runs active learning workshops in London schools to help raise awareness of the importance of good oral health and hygiene within our local communities.

The Dickson Poon School of Law

Students work alongside qualified lawyers at King's Legal Clinic to offer free legal advice to individuals, community groups and small businesses who might not otherwise be able to afford legal support.

Faculty of Life Sciences & Medicine

The London Medical Imaging and AI Centre for Value-Based Healthcare at King's uses advanced imaging and AI technologies to optimise patient care and hospital operations in London and beyond.

Faculty of Natural & Mathematical Sciences

King's Factor, an after-school London maths club, offers young people from underprivileged backgrounds the opportunity to enrich their mathematics in a challenging and supportive environment through extra maths classes and tuition from King's staff.

Florence Nightingale Faculty of Nursing, Midwifery & Palliative Care

King's is leading a CapitalMidwife research project exploring the job choices of student and qualified midwives to help improve the recruitment and retention of midwives in the capital.

Institute of Psychiatry, Psychology & Neuroscience

Most mental health problems first emerge at school age and King's researchers are working with more than 3,000 school pupils across south London to better understand ways to promote good mental health in young people from all backgrounds.

Faculty of Social Science & Public Policy

The School of Education, Communication & Society partners with 150 schools in Greater London to provide placements for King's PGCE teacher training students across the capital.

Our staff, students and alumni already work closely with local charities, schools and voluntary organisations and we know that these partnerships add value to research, education and to the communities around us. With our home boroughs of Lambeth, Southwark and Westminster, we've collectively mapped local need against King's core strengths and identified four areas where we can do even more to serve, support and sustain our local communities:

strengthening communities and helping them develop solutions to the problems they face

That's why we're building stronger relationships with local authorities and working side by side with local organisations and community leaders to develop collaborative approaches to our shared challenges.



PARTNERSHIP IN PRACTICE

Education and attainment

King's supports **IntoU**niversity's Lambeth centre where students can volunteer as peer-to-peer mentors. By working with local young people to realise their ambitions into higher education, they help them to aim high and achieve their potential.

Health and wellbeing

King's Health Partners brings together King's College London with Guy's and St Thomas', King's College Hospital and South London and Maudsley NHS Foundation Trusts to address some of the most challenging health issues facing London and its communities.

Supporting business and enterprise

The Faculty of Natural and Mathematical Sciences hosts the Centre for Urban Science and Progress London (CUSP London) which brings together researchers, businesses, local authorities and government agencies to draw on London as a living laboratory to analyse complex data and unlock insights into the city around us.

Strengthening community resilience

Pioneering project Parent Power, from King's Widening Participation department and community organising charity Citizens UK, harnesses the power of parents to inspire young people from underrepresented groups to pursue higher education.

KING'S CIVIC CHALLENGE

King's Civic Challenge is an annual competition that empowers students, staff and local communities to make a lasting difference by teaming up to co-create imaginative solutions to local challenges.

All participants can take part in training and coaching sessions to generate, prepare and refine their ideas.

Shortlisted teams participate in a grand final, pitching their ideas in front of a panel of judges and a live audience, with the chance to win funding and support to get their ideas off the ground.

BOARD BANK

Board Bank connects King's staff and students with local charities and organisations that are looking to recruit new trustees.

King's developed Board Bank in response to requests from local organisations to support them in recruiting trustees. It also meets the ambitions of King's staff and students to collaborate more closely with local communities.
