The Unit, led by **Prof Peter Sasieni**, works with a range of national and international collaborators to develop the evidence base for new and improved cancer prevention interventions, screening tests and early detection strategies.

CANCER TYPES

Breast, bladder, cervix, oesophagus, anal, lung, prostate, bowel, skin

INTERVENTIONS

Screening, therapeutic, prevention, behavioural, smoking cessation

APPROACHES

Long-term follow-up, tissue collection, quality control of intervention

PAST ACHIEVEMENTS

IBIS-II was a randomised controlled trial (RCT) in 16 countries. It showed that women given a drug called anastrozole were 53% less likely to develop breast cancer than those given a placebo.

Out of Hours was the first of three population-based trials of simple interventions to increase participation in breast screening.

PANTERA showed the feasibility, acceptability and safety of exercise training as a novel therapy for men with localised prostate cancer.

TEC was the first RCT demonstrating that E-cigarettes are more effective for smoking cessation than nicotine replacement therapy.

CURRENT TRIALS

ALOHA is an RCT of different ways of offering self-sampling (with HPV testing) to increase cervical screening coverage by providing a more acceptable and convenient option to women.

BEST3 has randomised 13,000 patients to see whether offering a novel test, Cytosponge[™], aids detection of oesophageal pre-cancer in primary care.
