Core	<b>4KNIP415</b>	<p data-bbox="357 165 1219 501"><b>Applied Human Biology</b> The aim of this module is to equip students with foundation knowledge in human biological sciences relevant to their field of practice. Students will be introduced to the principles of human physiology, anatomy and pharmacology. The course will provide a framework of biological knowledge to underpin safe and effective nursing practice.</p> <p data-bbox="357 539 1219 920">The module content emphasises humans as biological individuals. The experiences of everyday life are used to illustrate the applied nature of the biological sciences. Homeostasis, as a model for understanding physiological function in health and ill-health, will be an underlying theme throughout the module. The contribution of systems, organs and tissues will be examined where appropriate to the physiological phenomena under consideration.</p>	30	1
Core	<b>4KNIP416</b>	<p data-bbox="357 987 1219 1211"><b>Family Centred Care</b> For students to develop an understanding of the health care needs of the family throughout the lifespan, and the importance of a collaborative approach to care in ensuring patients/clients/service users' health needs are met.</p> <p data-bbox="357 1249 1219 1541">The module will explore nurses' working relationships with other professional groups in the provision of care for families, and patient involvement in their own care in partnership with the nurse, along with the impact of issues such as safeguarding, disability, mental health nursing, and common events such as birth, chronic disease and end of life care.</p>	30	2
Core	<b>4KNIP417</b>	<p data-bbox="357 1606 1219 1785"><b>Nurses in Society</b> For students to develop an understanding of the role of nursing in contemporary healthcare with particular emphasis on professional values/philosophy of nursing practice.</p> <p data-bbox="357 1854 1219 2145">The module will explore such topics as the role of the nurse in collaborative and multidisciplinary care teams, the public and professional image of nursing within the changing role of the nurse, ethical legal and professional decision-making, and will allow students the opportunity to develop self-awareness of their own professional practice.</p>	30	1

Core	<b>5KNIP517</b>	<p><b>Nursing Adults with Long Term Conditions</b></p> <p>The aim of this module is to enhance students' level of understanding and awareness of the major long term conditions that affects adults in the United Kingdom (UK). This module will enhance evidenced-based knowledge and analytical skills in assessing, implementing and evaluating nursing care that the individual person/family/carer receive in relation to the management of a long term condition. The module will cover conditions such as: constipation, depression stress and anxiety, cancer, diabetes, palliative care as a long-term condition, heart failure, dementia, inflammatory bowel disease, HIV.</p>	30	1
Core	<b>5KNIP519</b>	<p><b>Nursing Adults with Acute Medical Conditions</b></p> <p>This module aims to provide students with the prerequisite knowledge and skills to assess, plan, implement and evaluate care for patients with acute medical conditions within the context of the interdisciplinary team. The module will include topics such as the assessment and management of: deteriorating patients, patient airways, breathlessness, stroke patients, fluid and electrolyte problems, acute coronary syndrome, nutrition.</p>	30	2
Core	<b>5KNIP514</b>	<p><b>Evidence Based Practice in Nursing</b></p> <p>The aim of this course is to introduce students to evidence based nursing practice. Students will be able to understand the concept of evidence based practice, develop ideas around their practice and understand how to apply their knowledge to clinical decision making. Topics covered include: research methodologies, formulating a research question, searching for evidence, evaluating evidence, use of statistics, applying evidence to practice.</p>	15	1

To enhance students' awareness of the process and outcomes of health care research and how these relate to health care provision. Students will be exposed to different approaches to research as well as a range of data collection methods and analysis techniques. A beginner introduction to health statistics will enable students to understand and critique statistical data reported in reports and research papers. The course will assist students to critically evaluate issues related to research utilisation as well as the relative strengths and weaknesses of published research.</p>	15	1

Core	<b>6KNIP613</b>	<p><b>Leading and Managing Care</b></p> <p>The aim for the module is to facilitate students in a personal and professional exploration of leadership and management practice for the newly qualified nurse. The module will examine professional leadership and management skills as an individual, within teams and as part of an organisation. The module will give students an opportunity to examine their own personal preferences, attitudes and beliefs of leadership practice, and identify strategies to overcome barriers to delivering care effectively. It will also examine policy and political environments which influence health settings, and review strategies to successfully enable change within the healthcare setting.</p>	30	1
Core	<b>6KNIP614</b>	<p><b>Dissertation</b></p> <p>This module provides students with an opportunity to undertake a substantial piece of independent writing. It draws on knowledge and skills developed throughout the course, such as evidence-based practice and research methodology. Students will have the freedom to choose the focus of the dissertation, supported by a supervisor.</p>	30	1, 2
Core	<b>6KNIP615</b>	<p><b>Nursing Adults with Complex Needs</b></p> <p>This module aims to enable students to understand and critically apply knowledge and skills in the provision of care to adults with complex needs including surgical intervention, trauma, cancer and end-of-life care. The module will cover such topics as: inflammation, infection, obstruction and trauma, re and post-operative care, care planning, prioritisation and clinical decision making for complex patients, national guidelines and local protocols for the management of complex care clients.</p>	45	1
