Extended King's International Foundation

King's International Foundation

The King's International Foundation offers academic preparation for bright international students to prepare for undergraduate degrees at King's.

Taught by highly-trained and experienced staff, King's International Foundation courses combine subject-specific classes and academic English with study skills that are important at King's and other UK universities such as critical thinking, essay writing and referencing. Each course is taught through a combination of lectures, seminars, tutorials and labs (for science-related courses).

Entry requirements

To apply for a King's International Foundation course, you must meet our minimum academic entry and English language requirements.

Academic requirements

You will need to provide a high school certificate from your country of residence (outside of the UK) with the required grades. We also accept international qualifications for most King's International Foundation and Extended King's International Foundation courses, including:

- AS levels
- A levels
- IB Diploma
- American and Canadian High School Diploma.

Study visa

If you need to apply for a visa to study in the UK, we can only accept IELTS results approved by UK Visas and Immigration (IELTS for UKVI (Academic) test). Please note this test must have been completed within two years of the proposed course start date to be considered valid.

Visa regulations to study in the UK can change on a regular basis. We recommend you visit the UKCISA website ukcisa.org.uk for the latest information and further advice.


