The rules are simple: explain your research to a non-specialist audience in three minutes. No props, sound, moving images, poems, raps, songs, or mimes are allowed; only a single static PowerPoint slide is permissible.

Heats will be held in March 2021 and two winners from each heat will go forward to the King's 3MT Grand Final on Wednesday 31 March.

The King's winner will receive a prize of **£500** towards research, conference, or public engagement activity expenses, and the runner-up will receive a prize of **£250**.

Previous King's winners have gone on to represent the College at <u>the national Vitae 3MT</u> <u>competition</u>, so make sure to sign up for a chance to be featured on the <u>Centre for</u> <u>Doctoral Studies Blog</u> and gain national exposure for your work!

- The King's College London Three Minute These Competition 2021 is open to all currently registered doctoral research students at King's.
- If you've participated previously, you're welcome to take part this year.
- Please ensure that you choose the correct heat for your Faculty.
 We may move your heat date if you have selected the wrong Faculty date. If you are unable to take part on a particular date, please let us know as soon as possible by emailing <u>matthew.coleman@kcl.ac.uk</u>.
- The judges' decision is final, both for the Faculty heats and for the King's Grand Final.
- 3MT prize money (£500 or £250) is to be used for research, conference, or public engagement activity expenses only.
- The Centre for Doctoral Studies can offer support to the King's Grand Finalist, in preparation for the national Vitae 3MT final, should this be requested.

- Your pre-recorded Three Minute Thesis presentation which will be used as a backup in case of emergency only (i.e. poor network connection you will be expected to make your 3MT presentation live on the day via Microsoft Teams, and your slide will be set up and ready to go, for the judges to watch and listen to you)
