Summer@King's Scholarship with UNHCR

King's College London Summer Programmes is offering **10** tuition fee scholarships to forced migrants to study on any one of the following programmes:

- > 2020 Undergraduate Summer School
- > 2020 Pre-University Summer School

We use the term `forced migrant` as an umbrella term for the following immigration backgrounds.

- **Asylum seeker** is someone who has lodged an application for protection on the basis of the Refugee Convention or Article 3 of the ECHR

- **Refugee** is a former asylum seeker person who has been granted refuge in a country other than their home country. They have been able to prove that if they are returned home, they will be prosecuted because of their race, religion, nationality, social group or political opinion.

- **Humanitarian Protection** is given to people, if sent back, would face punishment due to a previously not mentioned case.

- **Unaccompanied Asylum Seeking Child** status is given in unique cases for children arriving to the country separated from their parents, for a limited period of time, usually until they turn 17.5.

- **Limited Leave to Remain** (previously Discretionary Leave to Remain) is given for applicants with unique cases to remain in the UK for a limited period of time

- **Long Residence Status** can be granted in case of demonstrating continuous residency in the UK for several years (sufficient length depends on age)

Undergraduate Summer School

The Undergraduate Summer School is an academically intensive, exciting programme and there are a wide range of <u>modules available</u>. The modules take place during the day each weekday.

The scholarship covers the tuition fee of £1,800 and the application deadline is 1 May 2020.

Who is eligible?

We are looking for excellent candidates who are passionate about thinking, learning and communicating, and keen on taking a first step back into education.

Eligible students must:

- Fulfil our standard Undergraduate Summer School admissions criteria with qualifications allowing them to study at university and offer English at level C1 in the CEFR. - Be able to provide clear documentation of their status in line with the list of immigration backgrounds listed above.

- 3. Upload your current Curriculum Vitae (in English).
- 4. Upload clear documentation of your forced migrant status.

Pre-University Summer School

The Pre-University Summer School is a two week programme designed to help students try out a chosen course at undergraduate level. The list of courses available can be found <u>here</u>.

The scholarship covers the tuition fee of **£2300** and the application deadline is **1 May 2020**.

Who is eligible?

We are looking for excellent candidates who are passionate about thinking, learning and communicating, and keen on taking a first step back into education.

Eligible students must:

- Fulfil our standard Pre-University Summer School admissions criteria and offer English at level B2 of the CEFR. They must also be aged 16 by the 1st September 2020. Full details of our entry requirements can be found <u>here</u>. If you are unable to provide the relevant documents please contact <u>summer@kcl.ac.uk</u> for advice.
- Be able to provide clear documentation of their status in line with the list of immigration backgrounds listed above.
