King's London

The Summer Programmes team will welcome around 1500 international students to study at King's this summer. We are looking for confident, motivated, and hardworking King's students to work as Course Assistants and help us to deliver a wide variety of summer programmes at both pre-university and undergraduate levels. These roles are vital to ensure that all visiting students have a safe and enjoyable time at King's and in London. The programmes for this year include:

What is it?

A one-week academic and social programme based in the heart of London (three sessions). Residential or non-residential.

Who is it for?

Motivated and ambitious high school students, in their final two years of study before university (aged 16-18).

What is it?

A two- or four-week Summer School based at the Strand campus.

Who is it for?

Individuals (mainly UG) from UK and overseas interested in taking an undergraduate level course at King's.

What does the programme offer?

- The chance to experience university life at King's
- Our Undergraduate Summer School offers a wide range of modules spanning subject areas such as health and science, law, governance, business management, culture and ancient languages. Some examples are:
 - 3D Printing
 - Terrorism and National Security
 - Finance and Financial Markets
 - Drug Discovery
 - Psychology. The Mind and the Body
 - Politics and the Media
 - Museums of London: Curating the City
- Use London as a classroom and find out more about their subject through course excursions and trips
- A social programme of events and activities to explore London
- All modules offer 45 hours class contact hours over a two-week session
- Full assessment and transcript issued upon completion

- Complete the online application form by midnight on Tuesday 11th April 2023
- If shortlisted, attend a group interview on $18^{\rm th}$ / $19^{\rm th}$ April 2023
- Interviews are likely to consist of scenario-based questions and group exercises
- If selected, you will be notified in the following weeks.
- Successful applicants will need to be able to do the following:
 - Complete a DBS check (via HR) if required
 - Register with King's Talent Bank (if not already registered)
 - Complete a 20-hour work week exemption form (for summer working hours)
 - Attend the mandatory training days before the start of your programme these are paid training days.
